3. **Get introduced** – If it's a fit, we'll connect you with the school. From there, they handle interviews, pay, and final decisions.

Two Ways Schools May Work With You

Program Teaching

- Teach regular classes, sectionals, or ensembles.
- You'll usually be added to the school's studio for smooth student management.
- The school pays you directly under their terms.

Private Lessons Through Schools

- Offer one-on-one or small-group lessons to students connected with a school.
- Depending on the school, you may teach from **your own studio** or the school's studio.
- Payment may come from the school or directly from parents — this is worked out between you and the school.
